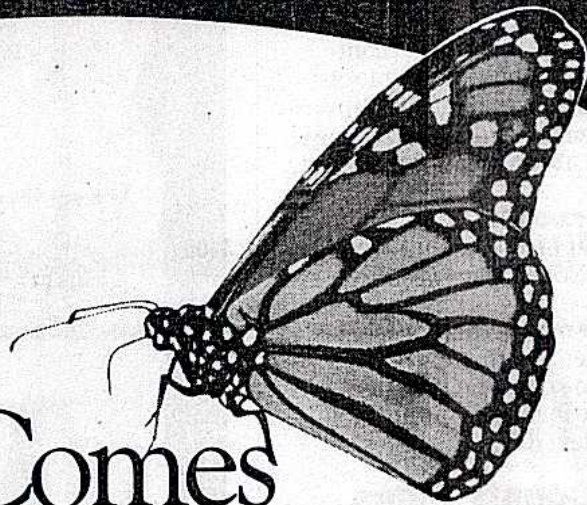


Teachers, Science Comes Naturally at Keystone.

- Case study – Glenburn Pond

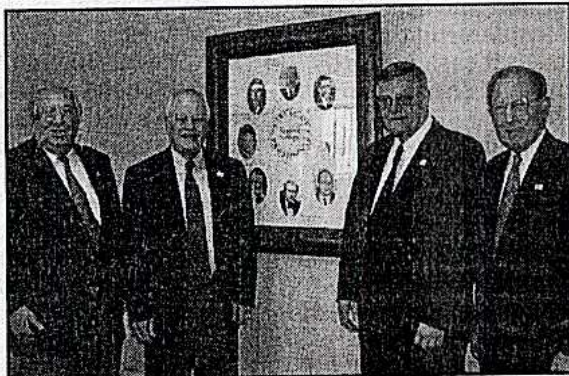
